## **Statement of Editorial Policy and Procedures**

To best reflect our purpose, goals and political policy as stated in our bylaws, we will strive to maintain the highest quality of presentation of information by the following procedure:

"Reporters" will submit their analysis of each warrant article that is assigned to them. This will include a brief description of that article including its intended purpose and any cost or tax impact, and the consequence of a "yes" or "no" vote, and an assessment of the reasons why some voters might vote yes followed by the reasons why some voters might vote no.

This article will be submitted to the Editorial Committee to check for any signs of confusing, incomplete or biased information. The article may be returned to the reporter for additional research and information, and resubmitted to the Editorial Committee.

The article will then be sent to the Webmaster by the Editorial Committee Chair for publication on the website.

We welcome, and actively seek, as much information as possible, without being redundant. When citing an official source, that source will be identified, i.e. Government docs. Individual submissions will not be attributed since they will frequently come from multiple sources and will be included in the topic's assessment as either a "yes" or "no" item to enable the reader to judge their merits, regardless of the source. The "Reporter" will make every attempt to solicit data and support for both sides of every issue we address.
